A word from the Rural Dean

We had a great Service at South Carlton on 9th January, really well-attended, to say thanks and farewell to Fr Sebastian and Alida. He has now retired and we wish them both well in their future life and ministry.

When I was at school, we sang at the end of term a hymn which still connects me not only with the vista of endless holidays to come, but with the poignancy of the departure of friends, the need to regroup ,and the excitement of things moving on.

Lord dismiss us with Thy blessing Thanks for mercies past receive.

We have a lot to be thankful for. Eight lovely churches, eight distinctive, locally embedded and faithful worshipping communities, broadly grouped as three hubs on the south, middle and north of the long thin parish. I have a huge affection for the place having lived there and ministered here in the past. I obviously compare it with where I mainly serve now in Nettleham. Fascinatingly, the population of each of the parishes is almost the same. Springline at the last census,4,047 and Nettleham 4,212. How many of the Springline residents described themselves as "Christian"? -67.8%. And how many of the population are in the oldest age group"65 and over"? – only 13.8%- a very low number for West Lindsey- Nettleham has 2.5 times more.. More than twice as many are in the great missing-from-church generation,"45-64" many more than in Nettleham. What a huge opportunity- a large parish of people most of whom describe themselves as broadly Christian (remember, no-religion was a choice) and with a preponderance of people in the age group that is economically and socially most active.

As you know, the diocese is confronting a challenging scenario across its 630 churches-falling attendance, the burden of maintaining demanding historic buildings, an ageing and dwindling group of people caring for churches, a failure to do what the Lord requires of us (to love mercy ,to do justly and to walk humbly with our God –Micah). And of course a thumping deficit.

Where are our best chances of seeing a flourishing church? Where there are a significant number of people (think Harvest) where there are already active congregations, where there are clear needs to be met (loneliness, mental health, lack of stimulation for young people, pockets of deprivation) and where there are good links with other institutions (schools for example). You don't need to be a theologian or an organisational planner to see where the finger is pointing, At you. Which is to say, for the time being at least at us. As Rural Dean I share I share with your Churchwardens the responsibility for these churches. You will at some point have a new incumbent – every Anglican church must –but it is unlikely we will be able to provide one entirely for Springline. My plan is to work hard in your parish, to offer guidance where I can and to sow peace and collaboration. We shouldn't do, as often in a vacancy, as little as possible to rock the boat and just tread water. The gospel imperative is now. Let us put behind us "to what am I and my church entitled" and think rather "with what has God blessed us and what does God require of us"

For the next month at least, we will provide clergy and lay ministers to maintain the existing pattern of worship, occasional offices, local prayers and pastoral care. Then we need to adjust – not only in Springline but across the deanery- and seek the best way forward to nurture our existing faith communities and attract new people to the life of the Kingdom of God. We will need to reflect on the vocations of the individual churches, and how they serve the flourishing of the faith across the parish. That might be more worship, more activity, and more public service, not less, and if it does, we will need all hands. *(Continued on Page 12)*





Ingham Parish Council Update

This update is based on decisions made at the last meeting of the Parish Council on 22nd November 2021 and actions since. You can find the most recent agreed minutes on the Parish Council website <u>https://ingham.parish.lincolnshire.gov.uk</u> and the Parish Council noticeboard.

Recreation area project: The Parish Council have submitted grant applications to both West Lindsey District Council and FCC Communities Foundation for funding for the project. Results from these applications will be received by early March. Thanks are extended to everyone who helped to support these applications.

Neighbourhood Plan: A public event was held on 8th October to obtain parishioners feedback on the assessment of possible building sites in the village. Following reports of confusion amongst participants on the night this meeting was rescheduled for 6th December. However, it was decided at short notice that, due to the escalation in COVID rates and the expected large number of parishioners who could attend in an indoor venue, that it would be safest to cancel this until further notice. Apologies to everyone that this affected.

The Parish Council have agreed to request an estimated precept of £22.876 being a 4% increase on last year's value. However, due to an increase in population in the village, it is expected that this will represent a much lower increase on council tax for the average household. Your Council Tax is made up of a number of elements which fluctuate but determine the total amount charged. This includes Parish Precept (the amount the Parish Council requires to fund its services), Amount of grant from West Lindsey District Council, Tax Base (the number of properties in the Parish), Local Council Tax Support Scheme (amount of financial support given to Parishioners on low income), Council Tax Discounts and exemptions (e.g. single person discount). The precept request amount will be finalised during January.

Following the resignation of Councillor Woods from the Parish Council, we have notified West Lindsey District Council that a vacancy exists. This has been advertised on the parish noticeboards. If you would like to find out more about the role of Councillor, please contact the Clerk.

Glentworth Parish Council Update

The recreation area project is progressing and a funding application has been submitted to West Lindsey District Council with a further application to FCC Communities. Decisions will be received in the new year.

We continue to work on the reinstatement of a footpath to Harpswell. An appeal has been made to the Secretary of State to assist and we await an outcome.

Lincolnshire County Council Highways have made repairs to Kexby Road, and improved the road edge of Coach road Hill during October/ November. We have reported the poor condition of Hanover Hill and Northlands Roads also. There have also been a few cases of fly tipping on Dog Kennel Road and these were reported to the District Council.

The Parish Council are planning to introduce new seating and wildlife flower planting in the village. We are consulting with West Lindsey District Council to see if the open space at Elizabeth Close could be utilised. Other places being considered are on the Northlands Road track and on the footpath across the field to Hillside Road. If you have any suggestions, then please let the Clerk or Councillors know.

The Parish Council have continued to support the concerns of residents on Hawthorne Close about the new dwelling on the previous open space. Significant concerns remain with respect to changes to the adjacent watercourse using gabion baskets and the associated flood risk, the rising main position and safety around the site. A supporting statement was sent for consideration at the recent Planning Committee.

The Parish Council have submitted an estimated precept request to West Lindsey District Council for £10,138 representing a 3% increase on the current value received. Your Council Tax is made up of a number of elements which fluctuate but determine the total amount charged. This includes Parish Precept (the amount the Parish Council requires to fund its services), amount of grant from West Lindsey District Council, Tax Base (the number of properties in the Parish), Local Council Tax Support Scheme (amount of financial support given to Parishioners on low income), Council Tax Discounts and exemptions (e.g. single person discount). It is possible therefore, that the Parish Council does not change its Precept and yet the Council Tax charged to you may increase/decrease due to the other factors above.

Finally, we have been made aware that there are plans to introduce 2 solar farms on land near to Cottam and West Burton power stations. The proposed sites are located close to us and other local villages. A public consultation has begun.

FRESH from ALISON'S KITCHEN

As Pancake Day falls on 1 March this year we have included our triple offering in this Village Venture issue to give readers a bit of time to prepare.

Grated zest and juice of 1

Starter: Smoked salmon wraps

- 250g cream cheese
- 300g thinly sliced smoked salmon
- lemon 8 cornichons, finely chopped
- 8 ready-made pancakes
- 3 tbsp chopped fresh dill

Mix the cream cheese, lemon zest and juice in a bowl, then spread over the pancakes. Top with the slices of smoked salmon, then scatter with the chopped cornichons and dill. Roll tightly from one side into a roll. Trim and discard the ends, then slice on an angle into 3cm slices.

Main: Roast tomato and grana padano galettes

- ٠ 500g mixed cherry tomatoes • 2 sliced onions

- Olive oil
- 75g buckwheat flour ٠
 - 100g grana padano, or vegetarian alternative
- 1 tbsp balsamic vinegar
- 1 medium free-range egg
- 2 bashed garlic cloves
- Handful fresh thyme sprigs
- 250ml semi-skimmed milk

Heat the oven to 200°C/180°C fan/gas 6. Put 500g mixed cherry tomatoes, 2 sliced onions and 2 bashed garlic cloves in a roasting tray. Drizzle with olive oil and 1 tbsp balsamic vinegar. Scatter over a handful of fresh thyme sprigs. Roast for 30 minutes, remove from the oven and heat the grill to high. Whisk 75g buckwheat flour in a bowl with 1 medium free-range egg, 250ml semiskimmed milk & salt and pepper, to make a smooth batter. Heat a drizzle of oil in a non-stick frying pan, add a ladleful of batter & cook for 3 minutes until golden underneath. Flip and cook for another 2-3 minutes until golden on the other side, then transfer to a plate & keep warm. Repeat with the remaining batter to make 4 galettes. Divide the tomatoes among the galettes, then fold in the edges to make a square. Put on a baking sheet or tray & grate over 100g grana padano. Grill for 3-4 minutes until golden and bubbling. Serve drizzled with crème fraîche (optional).

Afters: Drizzled Classic Crêpes

• 300g Nutella

- 150ml double cream
- 16 ready-made sweet crêpes or pancakes, about 20cm diameter
- 70g chopped toasted hazelnuts
- 3 tbsp Frangelico or rum
- Crème fraîche to serve (optional)

Heat the oven to 180°C/fan160°C/ gas 4. Put the Nutella, double cream and Frangelico (or rum) in a pan and warm very gently, stirring constantly, to melt everything together and form a smooth sauce. Allow to cool slightly. Put a crepe in a 20cm cake tin with a removable base, then spread over a thin layer of the sauce with the back of a spoon and add a scattering of hazelnuts. Put another crepe on top and repeat until all the crepes have been used up (leave the last crepe naked – you should still have some sauce and a few nuts left). Put an ovenproof plate or cake tin base on top of the crepes, then bake for 20 minutes until the pancake cake is hot throughout. Re-warm the chocolate sauce. Take the cake out of the oven, carefully remove the ovenproof plate or cake tin base from the top, then remove the sides of the cake tin, leaving the cake on its base. Drizzle with the remaining sauce and scatter with more hazelnuts. Cut the pancake cake into wedges to serve, with a dollop of crème fraîche if you like.

How it all started!

Brattleby Cliff and RAF Scampton.

The first powered flight was made on December 17th 1903 by Wilbur and Orville Wright.

By 1914 warfare was to accelerate the development of the powered aircraft.

The attacks of 1915 by the German Graff Zeppelin, aided and guided inland by the waters of the Humber, needed urgent attention.

Home Defence assigned Squadron 33 of the Royal Flying Corps the task of protecting our Eastern coast from the

Wash to the Humber.

Their aircraft was the Royal Aircraft Factory, Fe2b.

A biplane of the pusher configuration, flown by a pilot with an observer, gunner, positioned at the front armed with a .303 Lewis machine gun.The



Squadron's headquarters and Officer's Mess were at "The Lawns", Summer Hill Gainsborough.

The mechanics were billeted at the Workhouse on Lea Road (where Aldi is today).

A landing ground and workshops were built across the river Trent to the south of the Ramper Road.

Three grass airfields were established at Elsham, Kirton-inLindsey and Brattleby.

Brauleh House Lodge HistorpeHall Aisthorpe Aisthorpe House Brattleby Cliff Airfield Scampton 916 whon Pana Roman Pavament

Records have it that the Home Defence Flight Station, Brattleby (also known as Brattleby Cliff), was opened on the site of the current RAF Scampton in late 1916 for this first operational unit, A Flight, No 33 Squadron.

The airfield was bounded to the east by Ermine Street, to the south by Pollyplatt Lane, to the west by Middle Street, and to the north by Aisthorpe House covering 287acres. Page 31

A brief word of tribute to the young men of 33 Squadron.

They were actively recruited by the RFC from many parts of the world, South Africa, Canada even Argentina.

Many lost their lives; it takes little imagination to know why.

To fly the Fe2b in clement conditions would be a challenge let alone on dark nights against the enemy!

The graves of some of these young men have been carefully restored and can be seen situated by the Chapel in the Cox Hill Cemetery, Gainsborough.



On the 1 st April 1918 the Royal Flying Corps (RFC) and the Royal Naval Air Service regrouped to become the:

Royal Air Force (RAF)

By 1936, the Royal Air Force Expansion Scheme had overseen a period of rapid increases both in terms of new squadrons and the development of new stations.

Brattleby became one of the stations, together with Kirton-inLindsey and Elsham. It was constructed to the latest specifications as a bomber station.

From August 1936 the station was known as;

Scampton Parish Council

At the meeting held on Thursday 2^{nd} December 2021 the following issues were discussed.

Open session – Steve Ulyat reported that he was still waiting for a response to his inquiry regarding the rewilding of the verges.

Speed Awareness/Speed Indicators/siting of the signs- A session had been held in Brattleby between 10.00 and 11.00am. There were 166 vehicles and 6 of them were doing speeds between 46 and 50mph. They would be getting a warning letter from the road safety partnership.

Litter Picks A litter pick at RAF Scampton had been held on 21st November. 8 people turned up and collected 8 bags of rubbish. At the February meeting the Parish Council would sort out dates for litter picks for 2022.

<u>Closure of RAF Scampton</u> Cllrs Bulteel and Sneath had attended an Engagement meeting. It looks as if Waddington are now taking on responsibility for the shop, school, Muga and will retain about 160 of the houses, although about 60 might be sold to Annington Homes but then more would be needed. The West Lindsey Plan will be published next April and by then the Parish Council needs to have put on the Community Assets Register the land that they would be interested in. It would not bind us to anything but would mean it had to be offered to us first at a reduced rate. We would need to investigate how much the maintenance of the land would cost.

There are talks of the A15 becoming the Trans Midland Roadway, stretching from the Humber to The Midlands. This would affect the area as the road would have to be improved.

The drawdown of the station has started. Once buildings are empty they are handed back to the DIO for sale. We need to make sure our views are heard by engagement with WLDC, DIO and LCC.

Footpath and the Village Green - There were still issues to be clarified and Cllr Sneath would contact Highways again to ask them to come to talk to her.

Parking at RAF Scampton -

There were concerns about the parking, particularly when there is football being played, about the backing up of traffic onto the A15. Overnight parking was also happening near the tennis courts and it meant that busses were unable to turn round. Cllr Sneath would take this matter up with Highways when they come out.
