Recreation area project: The Parish Council are very excited to announce that they have been successful in applying for £73,205.46 from FCC Communities Foundation, necessary to deliver the play park project. FCC Communities Foundation is a not for profit business that awards grants for community projects through the Landfill Communities Fund. We will now work with the selected contractor to start scheduling the project delivery.

years, our domestication

of dogs coincides with the evolution of early breeds of dogs about 150,000 years ago. The first special relationship between a dog and a blind person is lost in the mists of time, but perhaps the earliest recorded example is depicted in a first-century AD mural in the buried ruins of Roman Herculaneum. The modern quide dog story, however, begins during



the First World War. with thousands of soldiers returnina from the Front

blinded, often by poison gas. A German doctor, Doctor Gerhard Stalling, got the idea

training dogs en masse to help those affected. While walking with a patient one day through the hospital grounds, he was called away urgently and left his dog with the patient as company. When he returned, he saw signs, from the way the dog was behaving, that it was looking after the blind patient.



Dr Stalling started to explore ways

of training dogs to become reliable guides and in August 1916 opened the world's first guide dog school for the blind in Oldenburg. The school grew and many new branches opened in Bonn, Breslau, Dresden, Essen, Freiburg, Hamburg, Magdeburg, Münster and Hannover, training up to 600 dogs a year. These schools provided dogs not only to ex-servicemen, but also to blind people in Britain, France, Spain, Italy, the United States, Canada and the Soviet Union.

The success of what was happening in the United States encouraged Eustis to set up a guide a dog school at Vevey in Switzerland in 1928. She called this school, like the one a year later in New Jersey, 'L'Oeil qui Voit', or The Seeing Eye (the name comes from the Old Testament of the Bible – 'the hearing ear and the



seeing eye', Proverbs, XX, 12). The schools in Vevey, New Jersey and Italy were

the first guide dog schools of the modern era that have survived the test of time.



In 1930, two British women, Muriel Crooke and Rosamund Bond, heard about The Seeing Eye and contacted Dorothy Eustis, who sent over one of her trainers. In 1931, the first four British guide dogs completed their training and three years later The Guide Dogs for the Blind Association was founded in the UK.

Since then, guide dog schools have opened all round the world, and more open their doors

every decade. Thousands of people have had their lives transformed by guide

dogs, thanks to the organisations that provide them. The commitment of the people who work for these organisations, and the people who financially support them, is as deep today as it ever was, and the heirs of Dorothy Eustis's legacy continue



to work for the increased mobility, dignity and independence of blind and partially-sighted people the world over. The movement goes on.....

We continually read news/articles flagging up the activities of Doorstep Criminals: fraudulent roofers, gardeners, service officials and other non-genuine visitors who target older people. Over the years we have also had first-hand evidence from our own clients



and carers.

As a company we have decided to see if we can help prevent this on a small scale and so we have had the Door Safety Sticker (attached) to give away to older people. To date we have sent out 60,000 upon request, since February 2019.

FRESH from ALISON'S KITCHEN

With Easter just around the corner, here's an appropriate dish for you to try with plenty of goodness to it. Swap the traditional cog for rabbit in this rich French stew made with shallots, carrots, bacon and mushrooms in a red wine sauce

Ingredients

450g shallots 25g butter, plus a knob

2 onions, thinly sliced 1 tbsp olive oil

extra to garnish

2 celery sticks, thinly sliced 600ml full-bodied red wine


400ml chicken stock Rabbit au 300g carrots, thickly sliced 200g pack unsmoked bacon

lardons or streaky bacon Few thyme sprigs , plus

2 tbsp plain flour, seasoned well 300g button mushrooms

2 bay leaves

(mine were 600g each, gutted weight, no heads)



Method

STEP 1

Soak the shallots in boiling water for 5 mins, drain, then peel - this makes it a lot easier to remove the skins. While they are soaking, slice the rest of the vegetables. Heat a large, wide flameproof casserole dish, then add the lardons. Fry for 5 mins or until the fat has run from the meat, then tip in the vegetables and cook for 10 mins until golden and starting to soften. Tip into a bowl.

Toss the rabbit meat with the flour, then tap off the excess. Heat half the butter and oil in the dish, then brown half the rabbit for 10 mins until golden all over. Add a good splash of water, scrape around the dish and tip the juices into a jug. Repeat with the second batch of rabbit, but use the wine to deglaze the pan this time, letting it reduce by about a third.

STFP 3

Add the rabbit and the vegetables to the wine, pour in the stock, stir in the herbs and bring to a simmer. Cover, leaving just a small gap for steam to escape, then simmer for 1½-2 hrs or until the meat falls away from the bones. If you like a thicker sauce to your stew, you can lift out the meat and vegetables and boil the sauce to thicken it a little. To finish, heat the knob of butter in a frying pan and cook the mushrooms with salt, pepper and a few thyme leaves over a high heat until browned. Spoon these over the stew, sprinkle with thyme leaves and bring to the table.


