Glentworth Parish Council Update

Glentworth Parish Council met on 30th March, our last meeting of the financial year, when amongst other matters of business, we settled the budget for 2022/23. This last year has been very productive for the PC, we have been able to invest in some new sets for the village which we hope will be added to when the play park project comes to fruition (see below).

We also discussed the plans for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, having just had the fantastic news that we have been successful in are application for a Jubilee grant. This will be used to help with a refurbishment of the Pocket Park, a project being done in partnership with the Village Hall Committee (who are also planning events for the Jubilee weekend). There was a working party that did some clean-up work in the Pocket Park recently and the plans are, subject to obtaining proper professional advice, to revitalise the pond, add some new planting and install a new information board.

As we reported in the last edition, the Parish Council are very excited to announce that they have been successful in applying for £16,957 from FCC Communities Foundation, necessary to deliver the play park project. The Parish Council believes that the recreation area and seating will make a huge difference to the lives of people living in the area. FCC Communities Foundation is a not-for-profit business that awards grants for community projects through the Landfill Communities Fund. We will now work with the selected contractor to start scheduling the project delivery. More news about this project will be announced as soon as possible.

Lastly, the Annual Parish Meeting and the Council AGM are to be held on 11 May, with the Parish Meeting starting at 7pm and the Council Meeting to follow at 7.30pm – both are open to residents of the Parish.

FRESH from ALISON'S KITCHEN

To Celebrate the Jubilee with this quick classic British summer dish. Our hearty coronation chicken salad, served with toasted naan croutons, is packed with flavour. You can make the chicken mix the day before, so it's great for a packed lunch. It would be ideal for the 'Grub on the Green' event taking place in Ingham, the Scampton village fete and picnic or for any of the other celebrations going on in the area.

Ingredients

- 5 tbsp mayonnaise
- 1½ tsp medium curry powder
- 2 cooked free-range chicken breasts, shredded
- 80-100g bag watercress
- 1/2 cucumber, halved lengthways and sliced into half-moons
- 100g cherry tomatoes, halved
- Juice 1 lemon
- 1 tbsp mango chutney
- 3 tbsp olive oil
- 2 naan breads, toasted and torn into large chunks
- 2 tbsp toasted flaked almonds

Method

1. In a bowl, mix together the mayo, curry powder, chicken and some salt and pepper.

- 2. In another bowl, toss together the watercress, cucumber and tomatoes. In a small bowl, whisk together the lemon juice, mango chutney and olive oil and season to taste.
- 3. Toss half the dressing with the salad and arrange on a platter or divide among 4 plates, then add the chicken and naan chunks on the side. Drizzle with the remaining dressing and sprinkle with the toasted almonds.

<u>Tips</u>

- If you like, add a pinch each of garam masala and ground cinnamon and a small handful of raisins to the mixture in step 1. Put the naan breads in the toaster for 3-4 minutes to avoid turning on the oven.
- 2. Prepare the coronation chicken mixture up to a day ahead and keep covered in the fridge
